THE DANGER OF RESISTING CHANGE

Luke 5:33-39

- I. First Interaction: (33-35)
 - A. Questions about: Fasting and Praying vs. Eating and Drinking
(Fasting and Praying indicated repentance)
 - B. Answer focuses on the presence of the bridegroom.
 - C. The Point: *The Pharisees were so focused on 'ritual' that they did not recognize the bridegroom.*
- II. Second Interaction: (36-39)
 - A. Christ tells a parable:
 - 1. Patching a garment (36)
New fabric vs. Old fabric
 - 2. Wineskins.
New Wine in Old Wineskins
New Wine in New Wineskins
 - B. The Point: *The way of the Pharisees (along with the system of Judaism) was too limiting (due to the confinement of tradition) unable to contain what Jesus was offering ... new wine.*
- III. The Application:
 - A. Note the contrast:
 - Feasting vs. Fasting
 - New Patch vs. Old Garment
 - New Wine vs. Old Wineskins
 - New Wine vs. Old Wine
 - B. Jesus is working to make us a new creation ... yet, our inclination is to hold onto the old.

The Call to Worship Isaiah 6:1-8

Pastor: In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the train of his robe filled the temple. ² Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³ And they were calling to one another:

“Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty;
the whole earth is full of his glory.”

⁴ At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

ALL: ⁵ **“Woe to me!” I cried. “I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty.”**

Pastor: ⁶ Then one of the seraphs flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷ With it he touched my mouth and said, “See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for.”

⁸ Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, “Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?”

ALL: **And I said, “Here am I. Send me!”**

If he does, he will have torn the new garment, and the patch from the new will not match the old. ³⁷ And no one pours new wine into old wineskins. If he does, the new wine will burst the skins, the wine will run out and the wineskins will be ruined. ³⁸ No, new wine must be poured into new wineskins. ³⁹ And no one after drinking old wine wants the new, for he says, ‘The old is better.’ ” (Luke 5:33-39)
