***LIFE MAKES SENSE WHEN WE  
UNDERSTAND THE CROSS***

Luke 6:27-49

- I. It is at the cross ... we see God's love demonstrated ... toward His enemies. (6:27-36)
  
- II. It is at the cross ... we see God's mercy given ... toward those who deserve His judgment leading to death. (6:37-42)
  
- III. It is at the cross ... our hearts are transformed so that we produce the fruit of obedience. (6:43-45)
  - A. Our fruit (actions and words) reflect the condition of our heart.
  - B. We must 'examine our heart' to make sure that we are in a healthy relationship with Jesus.
  
- IV. It is at the cross ... we discover the foundation to build our life upon. (6:46-49)
  - A. Our words must correlate with our actions.
  - B. The floods will come ... the torrents will strike.
  - C. The end result (standing strong or complete destruction) will be determined by the foundation we have built our life upon.

<sup>43</sup> "No good tree bears bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit.  
<sup>44</sup> Each tree is recognized by its own fruit. People do not pick figs from thornbushes, or grapes from briars. <sup>45</sup> The good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and the evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart. For out of the overflow of his heart his mouth speaks.

<sup>46</sup> "Why do you call me, 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say? <sup>47</sup> I will show you what he is like who comes to me and hears my words and puts them into practice. <sup>48</sup> He is like a man building a house, who dug down deep and laid the foundation on rock.
