BROKENNESS ... THE PATH TO SATISFACTION

Luke 9:10-17

I. Ministry Update: (9:10)

A. Most likely more than a few words.

B. Exciting ... but much more to experience in the days ahead.

II. Ministry Continues: (9:10-17)

A. Preaching and Healing (10-11)

B. Disciples concern for the crowd (12)

1. Send them away

2. They will soon need food and lodging.

C. Jesus ministers to the Disciples (13-15)

1. Jesus' solution – You feed them!

2. Disciples: We thought of that ... but our resources are limited.

3. Jesus: Bring order to the crowd — sitting them in groups of 50

4. Disciples obeyed.

D. Jesus ministers to the crowd. (16-17)

1. Jesus took the limited resources.

2. Looked to God and prayed – giving thanks.

3. He then broke the fish and bread.

4. Disciples took the broken resources and fed the people.

5. Everyone ate ... and were satisfied.

6. There were twelve baskets of broken pieces left over.

III. The Point: *Given ... broken ... and used by God*

A. God uses our limited resources to accomplish His will in the lives of those who are hungry and are looking for shelter.

B. His grace is sufficient – *Greater than our need*

C. Our resources must be given ... broken ... and used by God ... *only then will we find satisfaction.*

D. Jesus Christ ... was given ... broken ... and used by God to redeem, forgive, and satisfy those who hunger and thirst for righteousness!

Scripture Reading Luke 9:10-17

¹⁰ When the apostles returned, they reported to Jesus what they had done. Then he took them with him and they withdrew by themselves to a town called Bethsaida, ¹¹ but the crowds learned about it and followed him. He welcomed them and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed healing.

¹² Late in the afternoon the Twelve came to him and said, "Send the crowd away so they can go to the surrounding villages and countryside and find food and lodging, because we are in a remote place here."

¹³ He replied, "You give them something to eat."

They answered, "We have only five loaves of bread and two fish—unless we go and buy food for all this crowd." ¹⁴ (About five thousand men were there.)

But he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about

fifty each." ¹⁵ The disciples did so, and everybody sat down. ¹⁶ Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke them. Then he gave them to the disciples to set before the people. ¹⁷ They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.
