A CHANGE OF PERSPECTIVE

Luke 17:20-37

- I. Living in the world with a Kingdom perspective. (20 21)
 - A. "Thy Kingdom come ... Thy will be done..."
 - B. "The Kingdom of God is within you" (Historically ... all of Israel's history points to the Kingdom of God.)
- II. Everyone will recognize the Kingdom when it comes... (22-37)
 - A. As noticeable as a flash of lightening across the whole sky. (22-25)
 - B. It will come during the routine of living. (26-29)
 - 1. Noah was aware and entered the ark. (26-27)
 - 2. Lot was aware and left Sodom. (28-29)
 - C. It will come suddenly with no notice. (30-37)
 - 1. Everything in this life will become insignificant. (30-32)
 - 2. Being with 'Kingdom bound' people is nor sufficient. (33-35)
 - 3. Yet, the 'signs' are evident to all. (37)

III. Application:

A Kingdom Focus ... helps to prioritize everything else in this life.

- A. We begin to understand the significance of the King.
- B. We become more and more aware of the temporary nature of our world.
- C. We are motivated to live for those things that are eternal.

Scripture Reading Luke 17:20-37

²⁰ Once, having been asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, Jesus replied, "The kingdom of God does not come with your careful observation, ²¹ nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is within you."

²² Then he said to his disciples, "The time is coming when you will long to see one of the days of the Son of Man, but you will not see it. ²³ Men will tell you, 'There he is!' or 'Here he is!' Do not go running off after them. ²⁴ For the Son of Man in his day will be like the lightning, which flashes and lights up the sky from one end to the other. ²⁵ But first he must suffer many things and be rejected by this generation.

²⁶ "Just as it was in the days of Noah, so also will it be in the days of the Son of Man. ²⁷ People were eating, drinking, marrying and being given in marriage up to the day Noah entered the ark. Then the flood came and destroyed them all.

²⁸ "It was the same in the days of Lot. People were eating and drinking, buying and selling, planting and building. ²⁹ But the day Lot left Sodom, fire and sulfur rained down from heaven and destroyed them all.
