THE LORD'S DAY

Luke 19:28-44

- I. A look into the thoughts of the crowd. (28)
 - A. After Jesus had said this
 - B. Their mind set ... "What is best for me?"

- II. A look into the thoughts of Jesus Christ. (28-34)
 - A. What is best for these people ...
 - B. He calls them to serve...
 - C. His actions demonstrate:
 - 1. Sovereignty over his disciples ...
 - 2. Sovereignty over other's possessions...
 - 3. Sovereignty over His creation ...

- III. The crowd honored Christ and praised God. (35-40)
 - A. Cloaks on the colt.
 - B. Cloaks on the road.
 - C. Whole crowd of disciples praised God "for all the miracles they had seen."
 - D. However, the Pharisees attempted to hold Jesus accountable.

- IV. Yet, Jesus knew that peace only comes when we recognize that time when "God comes to us." (41-44)
 - A. God is hidden from us when we are 'self-focused.'
 - This is why we come to this Table.
 - B. It is through the significance of this Table that we see that worship and praise do not produce peace ...
