BLIND JUSTICE

Luke 22:66-71

- I. Jesus questioned by the religious authorities (the council of the elders of the people). (66)
 - A. Chief priests and teachers of the law.
 - B. Their verdict was final even before Jesus spoke a word.
- II. Their focus: 'affirm your blaspheme.' (67-70)
 - A. "If you are the Christ...tell us"
 - B. "Are you the Son of God?"
- III. Christ's response to the religious leaders: (67-70)
 - A. You reject the truth.
 - B. You have stopped thinking.
 - C. You do not have the power to create your own reality.
 - D. You are talking to one with greater authority...
- IV. The religious leaders left content ... but totally lost in their own darkness. (71)
- V. Application: Three cautions –
 - A. Do not reject the truth due to your preconceived ideas.
 - B. Do not stop learning by ignoring God's Word.
 - C. Why would we want to live in 'our reality' when we are invited to live in 'God's reality?'
